## ESCMID invitation to submit topics for clinical practice guidelines – deadline extended

ESCMID is launching a new survey, after the first one in 2019, to select priority areas where clinical practice guidelines are lacking, in the field of infectious diseases, clinical microbiology and infection control.

BIA is among the ESCMID partners in scientific issues, and we would like to invite you to participate in order to collect your suggestions. We would ask you to suggest clinical topics where, according to your best judgement, ESCMID should develop a clinical guidance document in the next few years.

Topics will need to fall within ESCMID mission to improve the diagnosis, treatment, and prevention of infection-related diseases, to have a clearly defined focus, and not to be covered by prior guidance documents in the past 5 years (at least from an international perspective).

# Policy testing: Canakinumab for patients with Still's disease refractory to anakinra and tocilizumab

We would like to invite your feedback on a Clinical Commissioning Policy Proposition on Canakinumab for patients with Still's disease refractory to anakinra and tocilizumab (adults and children 2 years and over) [2002]. This is a new policy that has been developed by NHS England and NHS Improvement (NHSEI).

The evidence has been carefully reviewed and, based on this, we have concluded that there is enough evidence to make the treatment available at this time. As a key stakeholder, we would like to hear your views on the policy proposition before it is considered further by NHSEI.



## Invitation to apply for the role of chair or health service representative of Technology Appraisal and Highly Specialised Technologies Appeal Panels

The National Institute for Health and Care Excellence is looking to appoint several people with the necessary experience and skills to join the appeal panel membership to fulfil the following roles:

- Chair of the appeal panel up to 2 people
- Health service representative up to 2 people

The appeal panel is responsible for hearing appeals against our final recommendations in the technology appraisal (new drugs and other technologies used in the NHS) and highly specialised technologies (the evaluation of technologies for treating patients with very rare diseases and very complex healthcare needs) programmes. When an appeal is submitted an appeal panel comprising five members is drawn from those appointed to hear NICE appeals.

To be appointed to either role, you will need to demonstrate a broad understanding of the NHS and its relationships with the organisations which have the right to lodge an appeal. You will also need to have an ability to draw out and articulate a balanced view on the issues arising from an appeal that are relevant to patients, carers and/or members of the public, and an ability to critique and weigh up competing arguments and make decisions (sometimes difficult ones) in meetings that are open to the public. Appeal panels are established infrequently and appointees may only need to sit on a panel two to three times a year.

The deadline for applications is **5pm on Sunday 26 September**.
